International Business Law

About International Business Law:

The course is set up for IBMS students. IBMS students are introduced to the nature and structure of law in general. IBMS students will be made familiar with theories and concepts of law. The course compares different legal systems and sources of law - e.g. continental European statute law and Anglo - Saxon case law.

ADIMM students will learn fundamental legal principals. They will be made aware of the contents of various types of law - e.g. private law, public law and criminal law. The course strives to illustrate the relationship among different types of law. ADIMM students will gain an insight on how law and business overlap and interact with each other. An introduction to legal practice and ethical issues will round the course out.

Course Format

The course is a 7 week block style course and is based on a "community of learners" model. Each member of the classroom is an important participant and contributor in creating a classroom community of learners. The nature of the course content calls for lecture and demands that students commit to a great deal of reading and memorization. Informed discussion, lecture, case examples and case analyses, and experiential and interactive approaches provide a platform for cooperative learning. Small and large group work, role-playing, one-to-one exercises, and student presentations are utilized. Videos and other audio-visuals may also be used if found necessary to enhance learning.

Function requirements:
